HSIN-Intel functions as part of the Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN), and functions as the successor to HS-SLIC (Homeland Security State and Local Intelligence Community of Interest). Fusion center personnel who do not have a membership with this Community of Interest (COI), contact the I&A Intelligence Officer that is assigned to your Fusion Center to request access. Joining this COI will provide you with access to a consolidated location for homeland security information, including P/CRCL issues.

# **TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE**

The CRCL Institute Provides Ongoing Technical Assistance and Training Support for Fusion Center P/CRCL Officers.

The DHS Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties and the DHS Privacy Office support the P/CRCL Officers at the primary and recognized State and Major Urban Area Fusion Centers through a technical assistance and training (TAT) program. Assistance is offered directly to the Officers and also support the Officers in their own local training efforts.
